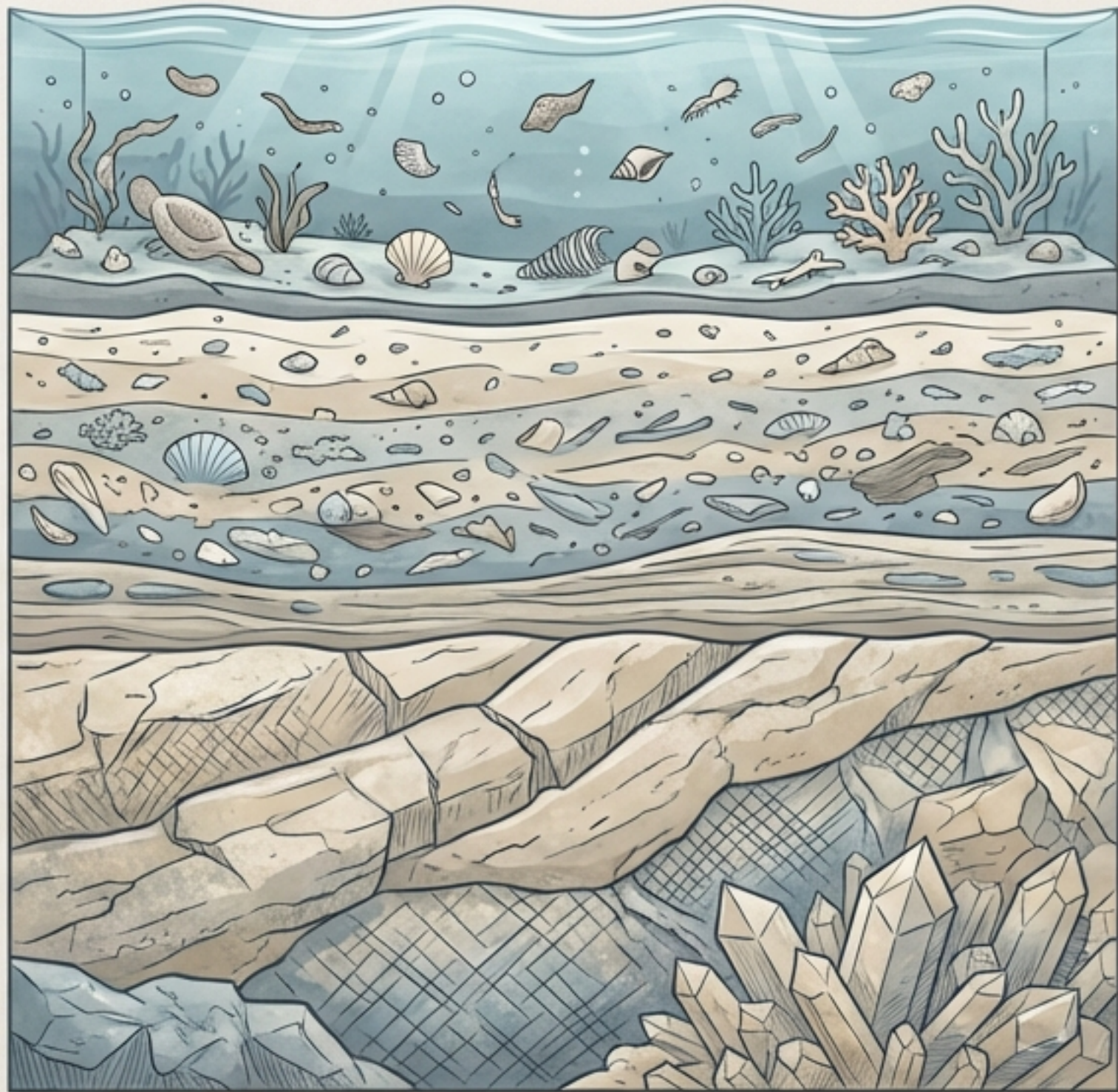

The Blueprint of the Ocean Floor



Stage 1 - Marine Accumulation

Warm, clear, shallow marine waters where organic debris—shells, coral, algae, and calcium carbonate skeletons—settles on the seabed.

Stage 2 - Sedimentation

Over millennia, this organic waste and skeletal debris accumulates into dense sediment masses.

Stage 3 - Fossilization & Pressure

The calcium carbonate (calcite) compresses under immense geological weight, solidifying into limestone.

Key Insight

Because it is a biological sedimentary rock born from marine life, limestone retains a naturally porous texture and occasionally features visible marine fossils.

Aesthetic Warmth and Organic Variation

Unlike the sterile, cold finish of polished marble or granite, limestone inherently adds warmth and a layered look to interior spaces.



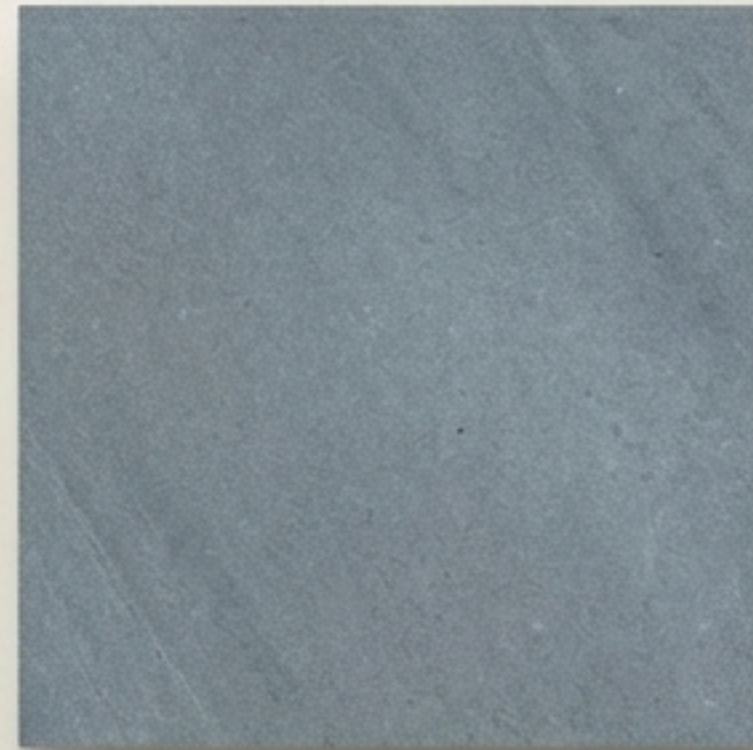
Swatch 1 (Ivory & White)

Clean, luminous foundations for elegant or contemporary fusions.



Swatch 2 (Beige & Pink)

Earthy, warm tones ideal for rustic or traditional designs.



Swatch 3 (Bluish-Grey)

Sophisticated, modern undertones.



Swatch 4 (The 'Lucky' Fossil)

Lowest cost. Highly durable but lacks natural authenticity and warmth.

Limestone

Highest cost. Extreme durability and prestige, but requires a significantly larger budget.

As a biological sedimentary rock, limestone contains zero harmful chemicals. It strictly complies with environmental regulations, making it entirely safe for natural disposal at the end of its lifecycle.



Fire Resistance

Limestone is naturally non-flammable. It provides an added layer of architectural safety, particularly advantageous in residential spaces or for specific client needs (e.g., smokers).

Structural Realities: Softness & Weight



Porosity & Softness

Though more durable than soft woods, limestone is softer than granite. Its porous nature makes it highly susceptible to chipping and cracking under heavy impact or high foot traffic.


















Mass & Installation

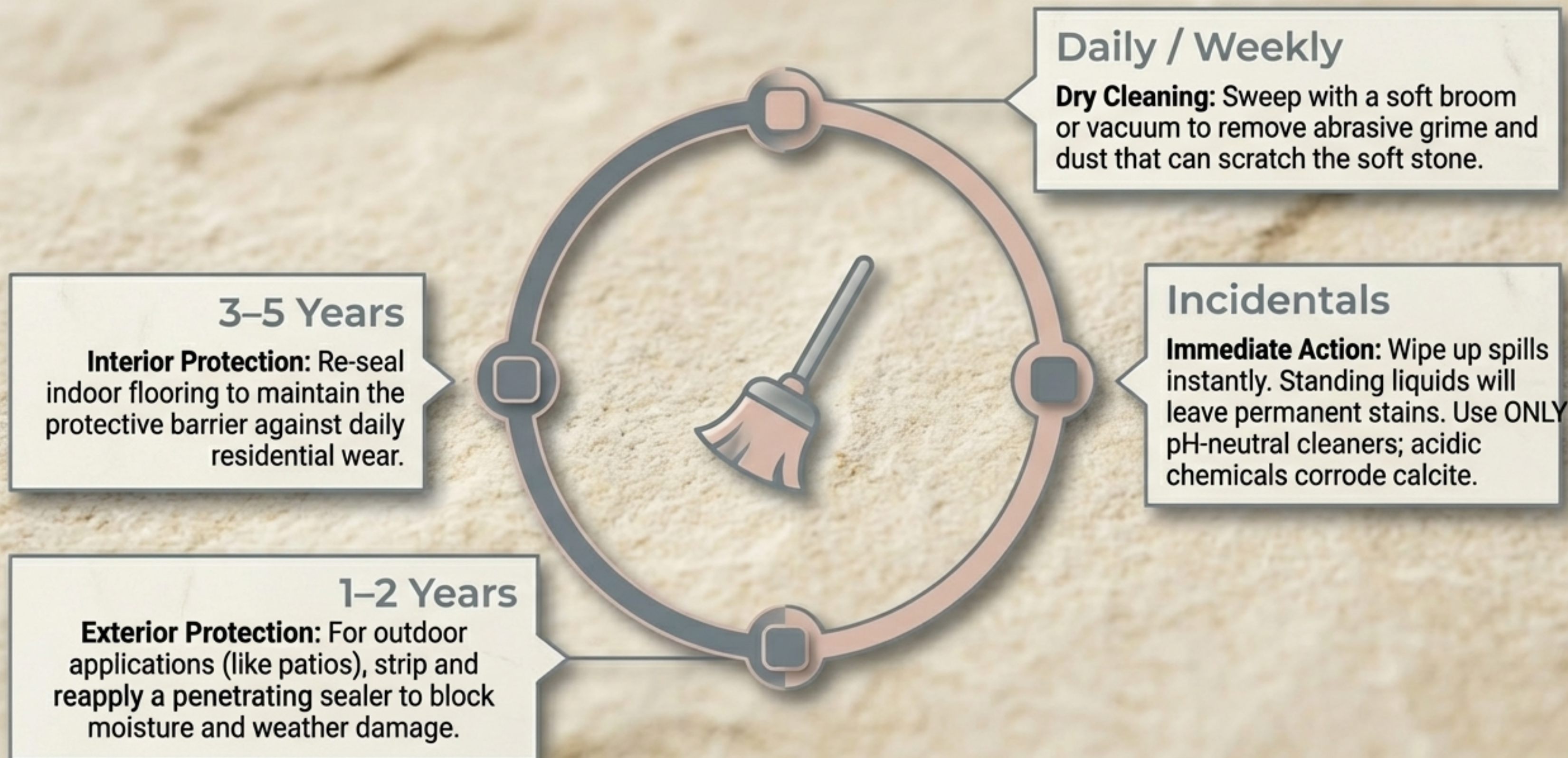
Natural stone slabs are exceptionally heavy. Larger format tiles compound this issue, requiring robust sub-floor structural support.

Logistics Note: The extreme weight complicates transport and handling. Professional installation is mandatory to prevent tiles from chipping or cracking before they are even laid.
